

# Free Louisiana Downs Selections and Analysis

**Best Bet: Touch of Iron (race 6), Longshot: Sequoia King (race 7)**

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### Race One Analysis by Jarrod Horak

#11 SENT bobbed at the start and finished 7<sup>th</sup> in a fast sprint race for the level on Sept 4<sup>th</sup>. Hails from a profitable barn, and Lejeune is 31% with this outfit.

#6 NEBRASKA NATIVE chased and weakened off a long layoff in the same race my top exits. Barn 17% 2<sup>nd</sup> off the shelf, and she is probably the one to catch.

#7 SEATTLE SUE ran a much improved race at Evangeline on Sept 7<sup>th</sup>. She set the pace and was caught on the line that day. Prominent throughout.

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### Race Two Analysis by Jarrod Horak

#2 LEALLAH'S ANTHONY was 3<sup>rd</sup> beaten a length under today's pilot Carlos Gonzalez in a local \$12.5k sprint on Aug 9<sup>th</sup>. Drop to \$5k level might do the trick.

#10 DANCE FOR CHOICE dueled and weakened at seven furlongs in the slop last time. Cuts back in distance and attracts leading rider. The one to reel in.

#11 SCORE TO SETTLE was 2<sup>nd</sup> best versus similar local foes off the claim on Sept 11<sup>th</sup>. That was his first start against winners, and stalker can move up today.

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### Race Three Analysis by Jarrod Horak

#3 SUGARFOOT SUE finished an okay 7<sup>th</sup> of 12 in Evangeline bow. Barn 23% with 2<sup>nd</sup> timers and 24% with maiden claimers, and better is certainly possible.

#9 ANOTHER MYSTERY landed place in career bow in the special weight ranks at Delta. Has disappointed since, but the drop to bottom should help.

#5 DELTA CACHET has the speed to make her presence felt throughout. Profitable apprentice Jansen Melancon hops aboard, so expect aggressive handling.

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### Race Four Analysis by Jarrod Horak

#11 SNUCK IN GIRL finished 5<sup>th</sup> of 12 in the slop last out. Stretches back out and might get brave if able to sneak away early. Finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in better Aug. route.

#9 LUCKY MARIA has been part of exacta in 4 of 5 local outings. Rallied from far back to finish a clear 2<sup>nd</sup> in 1<sup>st</sup> start versus winners last time. Has tactical speed.

#1 SILVER PRODUCTION landed the place in the \$12.5k ranks last time, and she should go well at the \$5k level, but note that she is 1 for 29 on the win end.

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### Race Five Analysis by Jarrod Horak

#5 CENTAVA is out of 15% FTS sire Exchange Rate, and dam has tossed two winners from as many starters. Sports local bullet and Torres rides for profitable barn.

#10 BIG RED GRAPE attended the pace and weakened to 4<sup>th</sup> in his local bow at 2-1. Barn 24% with 2<sup>nd</sup> timers, and he came back to work a bullet for this.

#6 GO TIGER JACK donned the hood and ended up a clear 2<sup>nd</sup> behind a runaway winner in an improved effort 2<sup>nd</sup> time out. Barn a fine 40% with juveniles.

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### Race Six Analysis by Jarrod Horak

#4 TOUCH OF IRON has fired in both of his local turf starts this year, and he can move up 3<sup>rd</sup> off the shelf. Attracts profitable 19% turf rider 'Cisco Torres.

#9 STARS OF FREEDOM finished an even 5<sup>th</sup> from post 12 when switched to the local green last time, Mouton 18% with his 2<sup>nd</sup> grass starters. Can improve.

#6 JO'S THUNDER earned an ordinary speed rating in his local turf maiden breaker last time. Robideaux 37% with new additions to his barn. Might move up.

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### Race Seven Analysis by Jarrod Horak

#3 SEQUOIA KING finished a better than appears distant 3<sup>rd</sup> last time. He raced wide after a less than ideal start off a layoff and can go better under Torres.

#11 TAMO TIGER has fired big shots in all three of his local sprints and could be sitting on a low odds win. Bullet work for profitable barn. Stretch threat.

#5 MITEYLIKEAROSE disappointed at 3-1 off a layoff here last time. Barn 22% 2<sup>nd</sup> off the shelf, and he can move forward for 40% Bourque/Stall team.

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### Race Eight Analysis by Jarrod Horak

#6 ROCKITTOWN was necked as my longshot play of the day last out. Won't get 8-1 this time, especially with leading rider hopping aboard...stretch threat.

#7 OPENING SHOW ran to his strong turf pedigree with a nice late running debut turf route score here. Has plenty of upside and will be finishing once again.

#3 REW'S BLUES is probably better on the sod. Landed place in 2 of 3 turf starts (DQ'd once). A rallying 4<sup>th</sup> in an *off the turf* stakes event last time.

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### Race Nine Analysis by Jarrod Horak

#5 WAR SMOKE could hit the ground running for profitable debut trainer James Hodges. Leading rider shows up here, and his drill on Sept 25<sup>th</sup> looks solid.

#6 BRAVE DAY is out of a profitable 19% debut maiden claiming barn, and dam has tossed two winners from as many starters. Improved work on Sept 24<sup>th</sup>.

#11 BOOSIER CITY set the pace and held the place behind a runaway winner in local bow on Aug 29<sup>th</sup>. Tony Richey a profitable 26% with 2<sup>nd</sup> time starters.

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
